### 

To avoid severe injury or death or important components damages.

- Never use the winch cable/rope to retain a vehicle during trailering.
  Never ride with the winch cable/rope attached to a load or another
- Never fide with the which cable/tope attached to a load of another vehicle.
- Only use the winch to help a stuck vehicle (snow, mud, etc.).
- Always refer to the winch manufacturer's instruction before pulling loads.

# **Avoid Injuries**

All moving components may create hazardous situations, which can be avoided when following proper usage of the winch.

Refer to all instructions in this guide to help you proceed in a safe manner, but always remain aware of dangers specific to your application.

Each situation has its own risks.

# Accessories and Modifications

Any modifications or addition of accessories may affect the proper operation of your winch.

Ask your authorized Can-Am Off-road dealer for suitable available accessories for your winch.

# 

Never attempt to modify the winch electrical system. Risk of fires, or risk of electrocution.

# SAFE OPERATION - RESPONSIBILITIES

## 

Unsafe utilization of the winch without proper precautions may lead to an accident, serious injuries, such as amputations, cuts or burns.

### **Owner - Be Responsible**

Read this User's Guide.

Always inspect and confirm the safe operating condition of your winch prior to winching.

Never allow anyone to operate the winch unless this person is responsible and has experience with winching. Consider supervising new operators.

Discuss the safety information with anyone who will be using the winch. Be sure that everyone understands the signs for proper winching.

# **Operator - Be Qualified and Responsible**

Read this User's Guide.

Become completely familiar with the operational controls.

Never use this winch with drugs or alcohol, or if tired or ill. These slow reaction time and impair judgment.

# **INSPECTION BEFORE EACH USE**

Always inspect and confirm the safe operating condition of your winch before usage.

### 

Perform a thorough inspection before each use to detect any potential problem that could occur during operation. The inspection can help you monitor component wear and deterioration before they become a problem. Correct any problem that you discover to reduce the risk of an accident.

# **Inspection Check List**

#### What to Do Before Using the Winch

ITEMS TO BE INSPECTED	INSPECTION TO PERFORM	✓
Cleanliness	Thoroughly clean all winch area, including pulling rope or cable out for cleaning. Avoid strong detergents.	
Synthetic rope	Verify if rope has any damage, replace if damaged.	
Wire cable	Look for kinks, tight loops, or broken wire strands	
Roller fairlead	Ensure area is clean, remove any obstructions, verify there is no damage or bends and that rollers run smoothly	
Hook	Verify hook is not crooked or damaged, and that hook latch closes properly	
Hand strap	Ensure hand strap is present. Always use hand strap to avoid injury.	
Switch condition	Ensure no cracks or exposed wires	
Motor operation	Ensure the motor works properly, also verify free spool works properly	
Battery condition	Ensure battery will have sufficient charge for operating the winch. When possible let engine idle while using the winch.	
	Ensure terminal screws are properly tightened.	
Solenoid condition	Ensure terminal nuts are properly tightened.	

# PREPARE TO USE YOUR WINCH

# Protective Gear

### Eye Protection

Use good quality safety goggles while operating the winch.

Do not use tinted glasses at night as they impair the ability to discern color.

### Gloves

Full-fingered leather work gloves protect hands from cuts and lacerations. Gloves that fit snugly will improve grip on the rope without binding to the rope while winching.

# Rigging

It is important to carry the appropriate rigging at all times on your vehicle.

### Sling

Use good quality sling rated for more than the maximum rating of the winch.

The sling eyelets must fit properly with the hook, with the hook latch closed.

### Pulley Block

Use good quality pulley block rated for more than the maximum rating of the winch.

Use pulley block to allow good angle of pull, or increase the pull capacity.

### Tree Protection Strap

Use good quality tree protection strap rated for more than the maximum rating of the winch.

### Shackle

Use good quality shackles rated for more than the maximum rating of the winch.

Ensure the shackles close and lock securely.

# AVOID ACCIDENTS

# **Avoid Injuries**

This winch can produce a considerable amount of pulling force.

Never use the winch in a condition that will result in dangerous situations

- Always inspect equipment before usage. Replace defective components.
- Always respect the maximum load capacity of the winch, including a safety factor.
- Always wear adequate protective gear.
- Never use the winch to lift objects or people.
- Always use the hand strap to manipulate the hook and rope/cable.
- Never put your hand on the rope/cable while winching.
- Ensure all components are in good working order.
- Never stay in the rope/cable trajectory area.
- Ensure good communication between workers and understand signs for winch operation.
- The operator must be able to see the entire work zone at all times.
- The rigging accessories are in good condition and appropriate for the work to be performed, including a safety factor.
- Always use rigging that is rated at least as much as the maximum load of the winch.
- The rigging must be properly done.
- No bystanders should be allowed in the work zone.

# 

Always stay clear of the rope or cable trajectory. A sweater or jacket suspended to the midpoint of the rope or cable will ensure the rope or cable will direct downwards in case of a rope breakout.

# 

Never put fingers in the hook or hand between hook and roller fairlead. A convenient hand strap is installed onto the hook.

# 

Never use the winch as a lifting device or a hoist.

# Avoid Winch Damage

This winch can produce a considerable amount of pulling force.

Never use the winch in a condition that will result in winch damage.

- Always respect the maximum load capacity of the winch, including a safety factor
- Never install the winch on another location than the one described in the instruction sheet or as factory installed on your Can-Am vehicle.
- Never modify the original equipment
- Ensure all components are in good working order
- Do not use continuously as motor will overheat, or circuit breakers will trip.
- Listen and observe carefully when using winch, to prevent overloading the winch

# Avoid Breakout of the Rope or the Cable

This winch can produce a considerable amount of pulling force to the rope or cable.

Any rope or cable breakout may become hazardous to you or bystanders.

Never use the winch in a condition that will result in rope or cable breakout.

- Always inspect the rope or the cable for any damage. Replace if required.
- The rope or the cable must be strong enough for the work to be performed, including a safety factor.
- Never route the rope or the cable so it rubs against a surface.
- Never loop the rope or the cable and attach it to itself, always use a good condition sling suited for the load.
- The rope or the cable must be in good working condition.
- The use of a winch remote (if equipped) allows to stay out of the working zone and have a better view of the situation.
- The operator must be able to see the entire work zone at all times.
- The rigging accessories must be in good condition and appropriate for the work to be performed, including a safety factor.
- The rigging must be properly done.
- No bystanders should be allowed in the work zone.

# 

Always stay clear of the rope or cable trajectory. A sweater or jacket suspended to the midpoint of the rope or cable will ensure the rope or cable will direct downwards in case of a rope breakout.

# Avoid the Release of the Rope or the Cable

When in tension, a release of the rope or the cable may become hazardous to you or bystanders.

Never use the winch in a condition that will result in rope or cable release.

- The clutch spool must be completely engaged to ensure the winch will not release when loaded.
- Always ensure there is still at least eight turns of rope or cable around the spool.
- The object to be winched must be safely immobilized once winching has been done.
- Never disengage the spool lock while the rope or cable is under tension.
- The tension in the rope or cable must be released once the winched object has been secured.
- The operator must be able to see the entire work zone at all times.

No bystanders should be allowed in the work zone.

# 

Always stay clear of the rope or cable trajectory. A sweater or jacket suspended to the midpoint of the rope or cable will ensure the rope or cable will direct downwards in case of a rope breakout.

# Avoid Hook Damage

Never use the winch in a condition that will result in hook damage.

- Always attach the sling to the hook so the load applied is in the center of the hook.
- The hook latch must be closed.
- The load must be applied correctly for the hook and the rope or the cable.
- The rigging accessories must be in good condition and appropriate for the work to be performed, including a safety factor.
- The rigging must be properly done.
- No bystanders should be allowed in the work zone.

# MOVING LOADS AND DOING WORK

# **Proper Rigging**

Your winch can help you perform a number of different tasks.

Rigging accessories are recommended to perform adequate and safe usage of your winch.

To prevent possible injury, follow the instructions and warnings from the rigging accessory manufacturer.

Always respect the load limits.

Always be aware that inappropriate rigging may result in serious injury or death.

Among all rigging equipment available, you should consider having at least the following equipment on your vehicle.

- Winch remote
- Sling
- Pulley block
- Tree protection strap
- Shackles

### 

Adequate rigging helps avoid rope breaking out or releasing from anchor point.

# Winching

# 

Do not exceed the load limits of the winch.

Load Limit of the Winch			
Can-Am HD 2500	1 134 kg (2,500 lb)		
Can-Am HD 3500	1 587 kg (3,500 lb)	Always allow a safety factor	
Can-Am HD 4500	2 041kg (4,500 lb)		

The following signs are a general guideline for safely communicating with the person performing the winch controls. Most importantly avoid any confusion by reviewing the signs you will use with your teammate before usage.



- A. Winch-in. Index and arm up, making hand rotations
- B. STOP. Arm up and closing fist
- C. Winch-out. Index and arm down, making hand rotations
- 1. Observe the surrounding environment. Plan ahead for your safest strategy.
- Ensure no bystanders are at risk.
- 3. Ensure good understanding of the plan and good communication between teammates for winching.
- 4. Become familiar and use standard signs for winching.
- 5. Take up any slack in the rope or cable and also the rigging before winching.
- 6. Once all slack is removed, verify your installation for safety, and suspend a sweater or a jacket in the middle of the rope or cable.
- 7. Proceed slowly and carefully.
- 8. Once winching is complete, secure the winched item, then remove the tension from the rope or cable and undo rigging.
- 9. After use, ensure to maintain a small tension on the rope or cable while winching in.
  - With the help of an assistant: have other person maintain a tension in the rope or cable while staving at least 1.84 m (6 ft) away from the vehicle.
  - Hold the rope or cable tight without letting it slide in your gloves
  - Proceed by alternating one arm after the other.
  - Once your rear hand gets close to the hook, have the operator stop, grab the hand strap and continue until rope or cable is safely stowed.
  - If proceeding alone, either pull a load to maintain tension in the rope or cable, or use the remote (if equipped) in one hand and the rope or cable in the other, while staying as far from the hawse or fairlead as possible.
  - Then activate-deactivate the winch one arm length at a time. Once you get close to the hook, stop the winch, grab the hand strap and continue until the rope is safely stowed.

10. When winching in, ensure the rope or cable loops are tight and sufficiently spread on the drum to avoid jams, rope or cable damage or sudden release of the rope or cable.

#### Vehicle Settings When Winching

It is recommended to maintain the pulling vehicle running at idle when winching to prevent battery drainage.

Pulling vehicle has to be properly blocked to avoid movement during winching.

If driver is operating winch from the vehicle (inside switch), ensure vehicle is stable, then apply brakes to secure the vehicle in place.

# **IMPORTANT ON-PRODUCT LABELS**

# Safety Label

Read and understand all the safety labels on your winch assembly.

These labels are affixed for the safety of the operator and bystanders.

The following labels should be considered permanent parts of the winch assembly. If missing or damaged, they can be replaced free of charge. See an authorized Can-Am Off-road dealer.

### NOTE:

In the event of any discrepancy between this guide and the winch assembly, the safety labels on the winch have precedence over the labels in this guide.

# Hawse or Roller Fairlead Label

### **⚠ WARNING**

Locate and read the User's guide. Improper use can result in SEVERE INJURY or DEATH. Follow all instructions and warnings.

Never put your fingers into the hook.

Always use the hand strap to manipulate the hook and rope.

Avoid putting your hand between hook and hawse or roller fairlead. You can crush your fingers.

Never use the winch to lift objects or people.

# Switch

The winch can be activated by a winch control switch on your vehicle.

Depending the version of the kit, a remote control switch may be included with the winch accessory kit.

The remote control switch can also be purchased separately if needed.

# Synthetic Rope or Wire Cable

### 

A damaged rope or cable may break suddenly and project objects at high speed or release the retaining force suddenly. Never use a damaged rope or a damaged cable.

### Synthetic Rope

Synthetic rope can be used in wet or muddy applications.

If the rope has a large number of broken fibers, or shiny sections or compressed sections, replace it.

# NOTICE

Never use a synthetic rope with a roller fairlead. It was designed to be used with hawse rope guide.

### Wire Cable

A wire cable can be used as general purpose winching operations.

If the cable is kinked, has tight loops, or has broken wire strands, replace it.



- 1. Tight loop
- 2. Kinks

### NOTICE

Never use wire cable with hawse rope guide. It was designed to be used with roller fairlead.

# Rope or Cable Guide

#### Aluminum Hawse

A synthetic rope is matched with the aluminum hawse.

### **Roller Fairlead**

A wire cable is matched with the roller fairlead.

### Motor

NOTICE

Proper use and maintenance of the winch will be determinant in the life expectancy of your winch motor.

# 

The gear ratio of the motor determines the number of motor revolutions for 1 spool revolution. Therefore the speed of the pull-in or pull-out will vary with how much rope is wound around the spool.

# Brake

The winch motor is equipped with a brake to reduce the amount of pull-out when the winch switch is not activated anymore.

Depending on winch usage the brake will wear out until the winch is out of order.

Signs of brake fatigue is the decrease of brake pull-out capacity. This is a good indication of the end of life of the winch.

BRP does not supply these internal components. The winch assembly needs to be replaced.

#### COMPONENTS

### Free-spool

Your winch comes equipped with a free-spool mechanism.

Simply turn the free-spool knob located at the end of the winch clockwise to disengage the brake. This allows to pull the rope without using the winch motor.



FREE-SPOOL LABEL

Always make sure to engage the brake before winching in.

# Hook

Your winch comes equipped with a hook.

# 

Never exceed hook capacity. Always ensure strap is properly attached to hook and hook latch is closed. Never remove hand strap from hook.

# Hand Strap

Your winch comes equipped with a hand strap for safe operation.

Use the hand strap to avoid hand injuries.

### **⚠** WARNING

Always use the hand strap to pull the rope or the cable.

# **Hook Stopper**

A hook stopper is installed to avoid damage to the winch, the hook, or the guide when pulling rope or cable in.

Avoid pulling the rope or the cable further than necessary.

The hook should just lean against the stopper.

### Winch Remote Control Switch (if equipped)

The use of a winch remote control helps staying out of the working zone and have a better view of the situation.

Depending the version of the kit, a remote control switch may be included with the winch accessory kit.

The remote control switch can also be purchased separately if needed.

# Winch Solenoid

The winch solenoid controls the current supplied from the battery to the winch motor.

# **Post-Operation Care**

Thoroughly clean the winch and its components after each ride.

Pull-out the rope or the cable to clean and inspect for damage.

Pull-in the rope or the cable for storage.

Verify all other components for damage. Replace as required.

# STORAGE

If the vehicle is to be remain inactive for more than 21 days, disconnect the  $\mathsf{BLACK}$  (-) cable of the battery.

Clean winch before storage.

Store in a dry and/or well ventilated environment to avoid corrosion.

Poor connection

- Verify if there are loose connections both at the solenoid location and at the winch itself.
- Check for broken wires.
- Check for corrosion.

Defective winch remote button.

- Contact an authorized Can-Am Off-road dealer to have switch replaced.

Contact breakers have tripped

- Allow several minutes to cool down before trying again.

Freespool is engaged

 Make sure to engage the brake so that the winch motor is coupled to the drum.

# 2. MOTOR LACKS POWER

Weak battery

- Check fault message in cluster.
- Check battery connections and terminals condition.
- Have the battery checked by an authorized Can-Am Off-road dealer.

Motor is damaged

- Have the winch replaced.

# 3. MOTOR OVERHEATS

Winch was used for a long period.

- Allow motor and circuit breakers to cool down.

Motor is damaged

Have the winch replaced.

# 4. WINCH WILL NOT RETAIN THE LOAD APPLIED

Load is above capacity

- Reduce load as much as possible.
- Use a block to double the line with a pulley block.

Internal brake damage

- Have the winch replaced.
